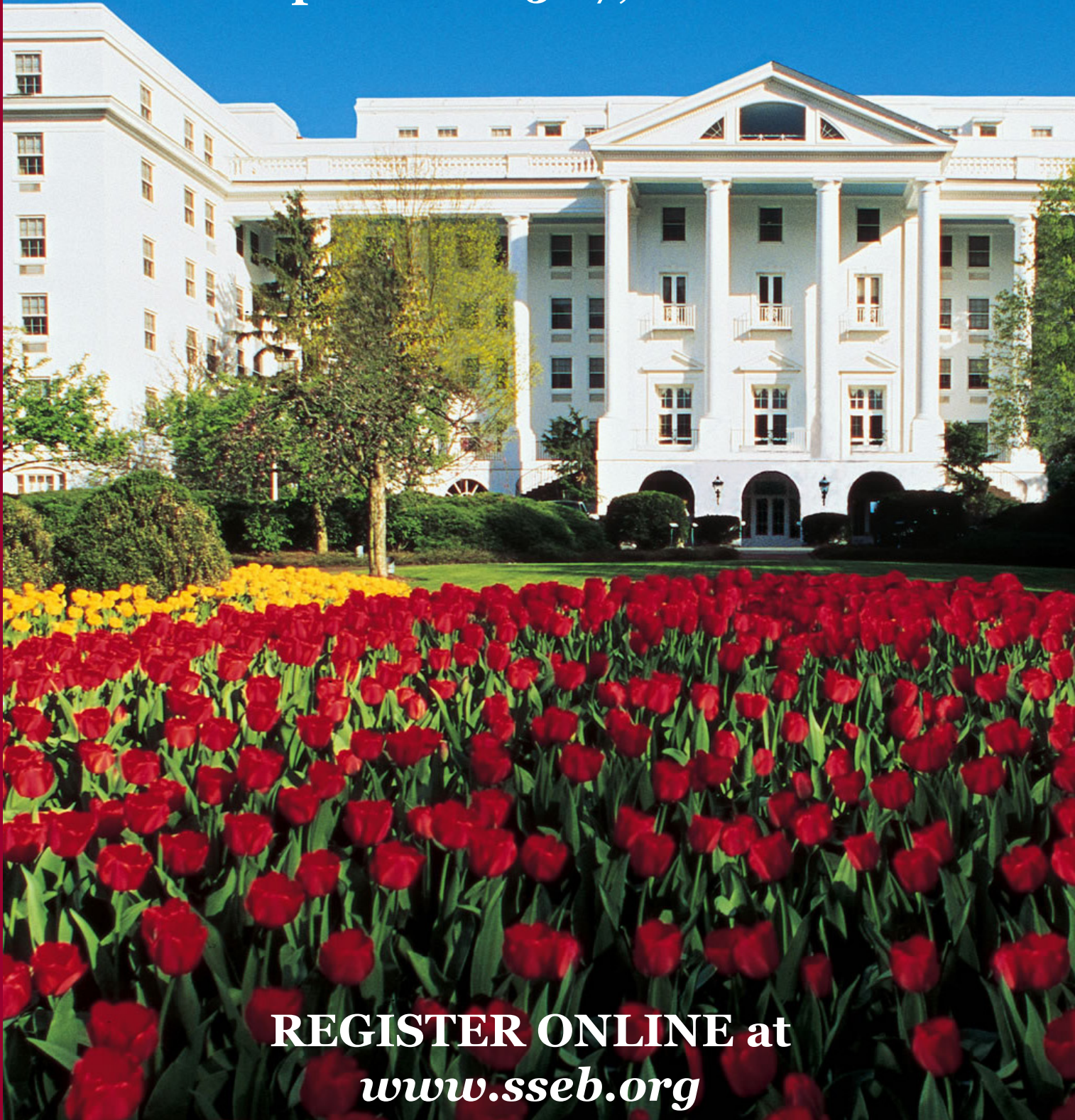

## Accommodations

Guest rooms have been reserved at a rate of \$225/night plus a \$25 resort fee. To guarantee a room at the conference rate, hotel reservations must be received by August 15th. A deposit in the amount of \$225 will be required at the time the reservation is made. Hotel reservations after August 15th will be subject to availability.

Check-in time is at 4:00 p.m. Check-out time is at noon.

## **Transportation**

### **Directions by Air**

Getting to The Greenbrier is now easier than ever with commercial and charter flights arriving daily just 15 minutes from the resort at the Greenbrier Valley Airport (LWB).

### **Commercial Flights**

Continental Airlines now offers commercial flights via the Cleveland Hopkins International Airport (CLE). Most flights arrive twice daily and connect Continental's extensive route structure to The Greenbrier from more than 130 cities in the midwest and northeast. And for your convenience, these new flights now allow easy daytime connection for guests visiting us from the west coast.

Beginning June 10, Delta Airlines will offer daily, nonstop jet service from Atlanta (Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport, ATL) and New York (LaGuardia Airport, LGA) to The Greenbrier.

### **Charter Flights**

Private and corporate arrivals also choose the Greenbrier Valley Airport (LWB), for its extensive runway and amenities. The airport is open 24 hours a day throughout the year to executive jets, chartered aircraft and all other general aviation traffic. LWB consists of a 7,004-foot runway, Air Traffic Control Tower, AWOS, and ILS, VOR and GPS approaches.

### **Ground Transportation**

The Greenbrier offers private and group airport transportation roundtrip for the Greenbrier Valley Airport, as well as surrounding airports. For more information or to make reservations, call 1-800-624-6070.
